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COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED ON BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT DRAFT WILDERNESS STUDY AND REPORTING SCHEDULE

Additional time to April 16, 1981 will be allowed for public comments on a Draft Wilderness Study and Reporting Schedule published today by the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Land Management.

When the draft (listed as Part B, Status of Current Planning Documents and Projected New Planning Starts) was first published in the January 19, 1981, Federal Register, a 42-day public comment period was provided. That publication did not specify the geographic location of Wilderness Study Areas (WSAs). A list of those geographic locations will be published March 3, 1981, in the Federal Register. Therefore, the 45-day extension will provide the public greater opportunity to evaluate the proposed schedule.

Comments should be submitted to the Director (430), Bureau of Land Management, 18th and C Streets N.W., Washington, D.C. 20240. Comments received may be seen during regular office hours in Room 5600 at that address.

BLM policy provides for developing a schedule showing when wilderness study areas will be reviewed and reports prepared. This proposed wilderness study process is closely tied to the Bureau's multipleuse planning system. The schedule calls for completion of studies on seven planning areas in 1981; 20 in 1982; 34 in 1983; 26 in 1984; 21 in 1985, and 20 in 1986. The studies will determine whether these areas have characteristics necessary for them to be recommended for designation by Congress for inclusion in the National Wilderness Preservation System or resource values that outweigh the benefits of wilderness designation.

REPLIES TO WILDERNESS PROTESTS ANNOUNCED BY BLM

Replies on protests received by the Bureau of Land Management concerning final decision made last November on Wilderness Study Areas (WSA's) in Utah have been announced. The announcement will appear in the Federal Register March 4th or 5th.

According to Dean Stepanek, acting BLM Utah state director, 69 protests on the earlier decisions were received. These protests addressed 61 inventory units. He said that each protestant has received, by certified mail, a decision responding in detail to the points of his/her protest. No protests were received concerning 120 other units listed in the November decisions.

Out of the protests received, those on 51 units were denied and there is no change in the earlier decisions on those units. Protests on 10 other units resulted in changes to the earlier decisions: 76,700 acres were added to various WSAs and two units totaling 16,310 acres were dropped from WSA status.

Stepanek added that if no appeals are filed on these decisions, they will become final on April 6, 1981. At that time 2,577,056 acres of public land in Utah will have been identified as WSAs. (This includes 117,360 acres of previously identified WSA's which are under appeal). These WSAs will receive further study as to their potential for recommendation to Congress for possible designation as Wilderness Areas.

SUMMARY:

The State Director's final decisions on the statewide

wilderness intensive inventory in Utah was published in the <u>Federal Register</u> on November 14, 1980. The decision was on individual inventory units. In that notice, it was stated that any person(s) who had disagreements with the individual unit decision(s) and had information which would influence the decision(s), could file a protest with the Bureau of Land Management, Utah State Director by 4:30 p.m., December 15, 1980.

During the protest period, the Utah State Director received 69 protests to decisions announced in the statewide notice. These protests affected 61 inventory units. Each protestant is receiving, by certified mail, a decision responding in detail to the points of his/her protest. This notice summarizes the results of the decisions. The following protests are denied and the decisions remain consistent with those published in the November 14, 1980, Federal Register:

Any person(s) who has information which he/she believes will show that the November 14, 1980, decision which is changed as a result of the protest decision is incorrect, may appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. Also, each protestant is allowed the right of appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals within 30 days from the date of service on his/her individual decision(s). In the event no appeal is filed, the decision will become final as of 4:30 p.m., April 6, 1981.

The right of appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, on these units is allowed in accordance with the regulations in 43 CFR Part 4, Subpart E. Any notice of appeal must be filed with the Utah State Director (930), Bureau of Land Management, 136 East South Temple, Salt Lake City, Utah 84111 (not with the board) so that the case file(s) can be transmitted with the appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. To avoid summary dismissal of the appeal, these must be in strict compliance with the regulations found in 43 CFR 4.411. The rules of practice require that a copy of the notice of appeal, any statement of reason, written arguments, or briefs must be served on the Regional Solicitor, Intermountain Region, U.S. Department of the Interior, Suite 6201 Federal Building, 125 South State Street, Salt Lake City, Utah 84138, and provide proof of service in accordance with 43 CFR 4.401(c) within 15 days of filing any document in connection with an appeal.

No protests were received concerning 120 other units listed in the November 14, 1980, decision. The decision on these units became final at 4:30 p.m., December 15, 1980. Those units, or portions of units, dropped from the wilderness review process on which no protest was received, were released from the management restrictions imposed by Section 603(c) of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA) as of 4:30 p.m., December 15, 1980.

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is inviting public comment on proposed guidelines for identifying and designating areas of the public lands where special management is needed. The proposed guidelines were published in the June 6 Federal Register.

"The Organic Act mandates us to protect our most environmentally significant and most vulnerable resources within a framework of multiple use," BLM Director Frank Gregg said. "We have a dual responsibility: to protect those genuinely important and critical natural, historic, cultural or scenic values that make the places where they are located special places, and to protect the public from natural hazards, and to do this without unnecessarily restricting these lands from any compatible uses," he said.

The kinds of areas that would be involved are those where special management is required to (1) protect important and critical historic, cultural, or scenic values, fish and wildlife resources, or other natural systems or processes, or (2) provide protection to the public from natural hazards.

Recognition of such areas is not new to the public lands or to BLM. In the past, however, such designations as "research areas" or "natural areas" have not necessarily included commitment to providing special management on a continuing basis. In the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 Congress directed BLM to give special management attention to "areas of critical environmental concern" (ACECs) on such a continuing basis.

BIM Director Frank Gregg said the ACEC process will provide BIM resource managers with a multiple-use planning and management tool that will be useful in special situations.

Uses such as the production of food, timber or minerals, and recreational or other development, when wisely planned and properly managed, may take place in ACECs, and will be controlled to ensure that the significant and critical environmental resources within these areas are not damaged or endangered, Gregg said.

The draft guidelines include the following proposals:

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- * ACEC identification and designation will be done through BLM's on-the-ground resource management planning process with opportunities for broad public participation.
- * Each ACEC's management prescription will be site-specific, individually "hand-crafted" to fit each area's particular resources or hazards.
- * An ACEC designation will constitute a commitment that future actions within that area will be limited to those that are consistent with the area's particular special management requirements.
- * To the extent that any otherwise appropriate use can take place within an ACEC without endangering an important environmental resource, or human life or property, the use will be permitted.
- * Involvement by local and State governments, private organizations and individual citizens will be provided for at each phase of the process.
- * ACEC designations may be made or revised only through an open public process including environmental analysis.
- * Responsibility for designating ACECs rests with BLM District Managers, after concurrence by BLM State Directors.

Public comment will be received until August 6, 1979, and should be addressed to the Director (303), Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, Washington, D.C. 20240. A public informational meeting will be held at 9 a.m., June 18, in room 8069, Department of the Interior, 18th and E Streets, N.W., Washington, D.C.
