## INDEX TO TOPOGRAPHIC MAPS OF THE UNITED STATES AT THE SCALE OF 1:1,000,000

The Geological Survey is publishing and distributing a series of topographic maps of the United States at the scale of 1:1,000,000 (1 inch = approximately 16 miles). Two editions of some of these maps are available as shown on this index. The IMW edition was published by the Geological Survey as the United States contribution to the International Map of the World (IMW). The other edition is based on a series of 1:1,000,000-scale maps compiled by the Army Map Service for military use. Although they do not conform to the IMW specifications in all respects, they do satisfy the same

In both editions, each map is numbered in accordance with the designation system adopted for the IMW series and is named for one of the principal localities or natural features

within its area. The map dimensions are four degrees of latitude and six degrees of longitude (twelve degrees for

Alaska). The areas range from 73,734 to 122,066 square miles. The maps show the principal cities and towns, railroads, and political boundaries in black; the roads in red: the water features in blue; and topographic features by brown contour lines and gradient tints. Contour intervals vary from 50 meters where the terrain is relatively flat to 500 meters in mountainous regions.

The area covered by each map is outlined in black on the index. Published maps are shown by name and number. If an area is covered by maps of both editions, the more recent map will be furnished unless the earlier edition is specifically requested.

The price of each map is \$2, but a discount of 30 percent is allowed on orders of \$300 or more, based on the list price. Price includes surface transportation for shipments within the 50 States, to United States possessions, and to Canada and Mexico. For shipments to other countries by surface transportation there is a surcharge of 25 percent of the net

amount of the order. If purchaser pays airmail costs, the surcharge is waived. Prepayment is required and may be made by money order or check payable to the Geological Survey, or in cash (the exact amount) at the sender's risk. Postage stamps or coupons are not accepted.

Note: Several 1:1,000,000-scale maps of the IMW series covering portions of the United States but lying principally in Mexico are published and distributed by the American Geographical Society, Broadway at 156th St., New York, N. Y. 10038.

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
