Amax Exploration, Inc. has submitted a Unit Plan of Operation in accordance with 30 CFR 270.34 to drill up to three (3) 8000-foot (2462 meters) geothermal exploratory wells out of a possible eighteen (18) sites on on Federal Leases N-8421, N-8428, N-9647. N-10311, N-11777, N-31991, and N-31992 in the Fishlake Unit, Esmeralda County, Nevada. A copy of the Unit Plan of Operation is available from the Office of the Deputy Conservation Manager for Geothermal, or the Office of the Reno District Geothermal Supervisor.
